



Joshua Series: "Transformed Lives" Joshua 5

## Questions to **Dig Deeper**:

1. How does the act of circumcision in Joshua 5:2–9 symbolize a spiritual transformation for the Israelites?

2. In Joshua 5:10–12, the manna stops, and the Israelites eat the produce of the land. How does this shift reflect God's transforming work in their journey from dependence to maturity? What does it say about God's timing in our spiritual growth?

3. The appearance of the commander of the Lord's army in verses 13–15 marks a turning point for Joshua. How does this encounter reflect God's transforming presence and leadership in Joshua's role? What does Joshua's response teach us about approaching holy moments?

4. Joshua recognizes that the armed man who greets him is from God, and this changes his approach. He first wants to know whose side the man is on, but then shifts to ask how can he (Joshua) listen well and follow God. In Matthew 6 Jesus invites us to seek first the kingdom of God. Where are places in your life that seeking God first comes naturally? In what parts of your life is that more challenging?

5. Joshua is told to remove his sandals because he is on holy ground (v.15). How does recognizing the holiness of God change our perspective and response?
