2 Kings 6:9-18

## Questions to Dig Deeper:

- 1. In 2 Kings 6:16-17, Elisha prays for his servant's eyes to be opened. When have you felt like God was present but hard to see? How might we pray for one another to "see" God at work today?
- 2. The sermon reminds us that "God is not surprised." How does this truth encourage you when life feels chaotic, uncertain, or overwhelming?
- 3. God's deliverance of Israel in this passage ends not with vengeance, but with hospitality and peace. What does this teach us about God's character and how we might treat those we see as "enemies" in our own lives?
- 4. Sometimes Christians can speak in a way that makes it sound like God is only for certain people. How does scripture challenge this assumption, and how might our church embody the truth that "God is for you" in our community?
- 5. Bill closed asking: "What is one choice that will look different this week because God is for you?" How would you answer that personally? What situation or person will your interactions look different this week because God is for you?
